### Introduction

The collection of the Rotary Club of Springfield, Ohio, was donated to the Clark County Historical Society in several stages by the club and its members with the bulk of the collection being received in 2012. The collection consists of by-laws and procedures, board meeting minutes, weekly newsletters, member directories, applications and memorials, committee reports, correspondence and financial information.

The documents date from 1914 to the present day. The collection fills nine large record size boxes, 4 small sized boxes and one flat oversized box. Photographs in the collection are located separately in the Photographic Category in a flat oversized box. The collection is arranged into 11 series as follows:

Series 1: Club History and General Club Information

Series 2: Members

Series 3: Financial Information

Series 4: Board Meeting Minutes

Series 5: Weekly Minutes/Newsletters

Series 6: Committees

Series 7: Correspondence

Series 8: Scrapbooks

### **Historical Sketch**

The Rotary Club of Springfield, Ohio, was started by W. E. Copenhaver at the suggestion of Harry S. Kissell. It was officially chartered by Rotary International on March 1, 1914 becoming the 98<sup>th</sup> club accepted into the organization. The club was composed of local businessmen who each represented a different type of business and came together for fellowship, mutual support and to serve their community.

Meetings were held every Monday at noon at various local hotels, restaurants and meeting places in Springfield. A speaker made a presentation on a topic of interest each week. The club's main focus of service is children with disabilities. It began serving children with disabilities formally in 1919 with the formation of its Welfare Fund for Crippled Children. The first county wide free orthopedic clinic for children with disabilities was held in 1922, the same year it started its annual Christmas party for the children. Over the years other services for children with disabilities included a school, orthopedic clinics, summer camp, and a cerebral palsy preschool.

In addition, the Club awarded numerous scholarships to outstanding high school students, recognized outstanding teachers, participated in a student exchange program, and contributed to Rotary International's ongoing effort to eliminate polio.

The Rotary Club continues to actively serve the community and has expanded its reach with several international projects in Lesotho (Africa).

# **Scope and Content**

The collection spans the years 1914-2014. Weekly newsletters intermingled with newspaper clippings, board minutes, committee reports and correspondence make up the bulk of the collection.

Additional information owned by the Turner Foundation includes three scrapbooks of minutes, letters, newspaper clipping and meeting announcements spanning January 14, 1914-June 1926 and a fourth scrapbook of newsletters dated September 17, 1945-February 5, 1951. A financial ledger contains payments by current (1950) members and financial statements from 1924-1950.

The collection is identified as Springfield Rotary Club. However, the official name of the organization is the Rotary Club of Springfield, Ohio.

# **Series and Folder Listing**

**Series 1** contains 27 files with general information about the history of the Rotary Club of Springfield, Ohio and the Rotary Club of Springfield, Ohio Foundation plus information about the local Rotary District, The Rotary Foundation and Rotary International.

**Series 2** contains financial and audit reports for the club and foundation, as well as contributions made in memory of deceased Rotarians. Financial information that was combined with the Secretary-Treasurer's annual report is located in several files in Series 1. The Activities/Budget 1951-1952 file in Series 6 includes the 1951-52 budget.

**Series 3** contains information about members. It has rosters (member directories) and correspondence about new members, member attendance and classifications. Detailed memorial resolutions honoring the life of deceased members are included as well. All monies given for deceased members are filed in Series 2 (financial) as Memorial Donations. Four smaller boxes contain member applications. Box 5 has a section with applications from people who did not become members and copies of forms reporting membership changes (classification, type of member, etc.) to Rotary International.

**Series 4** contains two record boxes of board minutes with agendas and copies of board packets with information related to the agenda.

**Series 5** contains four record boxes of weekly minutes/newsletters. The information was called weekly minutes and *RotariaNews* over the years. The format of the weekly information varied from typewritten pages to printed documents, in various sizes, to an online publication. Newspaper clippings about club members and activities are interspersed throughout some of the older files.

Series 6 contains a little more than one full record box of information about the club's committees and their activities. It includes annual committee reports prepared for the district governor and club members, committee correspondence. The original Welfare Committee quickly became the Crippled Children's Committee and was later renamed the Handicapped Children Committee then the Committee for Service to Children with Disabilities and, finally, the Committee for Service to People with Disabilities. The committee and its paid caseworker, later known as the executive director, administered the program day for children with disabilities including the annual Christmas party, summer camp and fair. Early files on the Ohio Society for Crippled Children, which later became Easter Seals, document the strong connection of the Society with Rotarians. Some correspondence in the Christmas Party files discusses a second Christmas party given for the Clark County Children's Home from the 1920s until at least 1950. An upright document box contains information about the Rotary Awards Committee that selected Rotarians for its internal Award for Distinguished Service and the Leadership and the Springfield Awards Banquet, led by the Springfield Jaycees, which included several local service organizations. Information about exchange students and host families is on file cards at the end

of Box 5.

**Series 7** contains general club correspondence by the secretary-treasurer and club members. Additional correspondence may be found in series 6 (committees) in the individual committee folders, in series 2 (members), and series 4 (board minutes).

**Series 8** contains miscellaneous scrapbooks including two large scrapbooks of club newsletters and newspaper clippings. The oldest is dated March 26, 1917-1923 with loose pages of committee lists dated 1924, 1925-26 and 1930-31. The second scrapbook is dated October 4, 1926-May 8, 1933 and contains a few smaller, loose pages dated March 1926. Two scrapbooks contain Easter Seal Campaigns with newspaper clippings dated 1944-1960 and 1961-1977. A ledger book lists the first 125 club members with their classifications and dues payments.

**Series 9** contains photographs, slides and negatives. The majority of the images are from various Christmas parties for children with disabilities and other club activities.

**Series 10** contains oversize materials including a scrapbook of photographs including 8"x10" portraits of club presidents from 1946-1990 taken by Charles A. Thomas, a 1936 group portrait with many Rotarians, certificates and proclamations.
