### THIRTY-FIRST OHIO VOLUNTEER INFANTRY.

This regiment was organized at Camp Chase between August 4 and September 7, 1861. Remained in camp there about a month and moved to Camp Dick Robinson, Kentucky, stopping over Sunday in Cincinnati. November following went to Somerset, Kentucky, and after camping there till January 18, 1862, marched to Mill Springs, arriving there at 1 A. M. on the 19th, and taking part in the advance on the fort. Returned to Somerset and camped a week, then marched through Bardstown to Louisville, thence by steamer to Nashville, and marched as the rear guard of Buell's army to Shiloh, arriving there at the close of the battle. Participated in the movements around Corinth, then back into Northern Alabama, and was with Buell in his race with Bragg to Louisville. Was on the reserve at Perryville or Chaplin Hill battle. Marched after Bragg through Kentucky and Tennessee, and took part in the battle of Stone River. After that battle Rosecrans organized an "Elite Corps," composed of men who had distinguished themselves for bravery, five from each company. The regiment remained about two months at Murfreesboro, and moved with Rosecrans down the Sequatchie valley, and engaged in the fierce action at Chickamauga, part of a brigade that for an hour or two was held in reserve, and then went in with a rush and captured a battery of six Parrott guns. Was acting in reserve the rest of the day, although the "reserve" in this case was not very reserved, being in action almost continually re-establishing broken lines. The second day the regiment was on the front line at the pivot, where the right wing broke next to Wood's division. After retreating a short distance the forces were rallied by General Thomas, and remained on the field till 9 p. m., then withdrew to Rossville, and next day to Chattanooga, where they were among the besieged until the assault on Missionary Ridge, in which the Thirty-First took gallant part. At Chattanooga, December 31, 1863, most of the boys veteraned and received furlough, returning to the army in February, 1864. Participated in the almost continuous fighting of the Atlanta campaign, was with Sherman on the "March to the Sea," staying at Savannah till the middle of January, 1865, then joined in the campaign of the Carolinas. (See previous record of Sherman's campaigns, 1864-5.) The Thirty-First was the only regiment of its division to come up in time to participate in Sherman's last great battle, Bentonville. After participation in the grand review at Washington, it moved thence by rail to Louisville, Kentucky, where the men were mustered out July 20, 1865, with the consciousness of "duty done."

### THE FORTY-FOURTH OHIO VOLUNTEER INFANTRY.

This regiment was organized at the fair grounds, near Springfield, in the fall of 1861, and moved, October 14th, via Cincinnati, to Camp Piatt, West Virginia, which was its headquarters till May, 1862. During that time companies of the regiment were engaged in various expeditions, one among them being across the Kanawha, to Platona, then to Logan C. H., and occupying six days. May 1, 1862, the regiment moved up the river to Gauley bridge, and was there brigaded with the Thirty-Sixth and Forty-Seventh Ohio infantry regiments, under Colonel George Crook. Established at Lewisburg, the Forty-Fourth made a raid thence as far as Dublin Depot, in Pulaski county, Virginia, destroying the track of the Jackson River Railroad, and then fell back to Lewisburg, where the Ohio regiments had a hot fight with a large force of the enemy, May 23d, and the Forty-Fourth captured the enemy's four-gun battery, and threw back his left. The enemy were routed, leaving their dead and wounded and many prisoners in our hands, together with three pieces of artillery. From this time till the middle of August, the Forty-Fourth camped at Meadow Bluffs, fortifying, drilling, and scouting. A force of six thousand rebels moved against the four Federal regiments in the Valley in September, and an engagement occurred at Fayetteville, September 10th, our force retreating, the Forty-Fourth covering the rear. September 11th occurred the fighting at Cotton Mill, and the next day our forces made a successful stand at Charleston, then crossed the Elk, destroyed the bridge, and were not further molested. The Ohio was reached at Racine, the troops taken by steamer to Point Pleasant, and thence the Forty-Fourth was sent into Kentucky. After camping at Covington until Kirby Smith's retreat was assured, and pursuing him as far as Lexington, it was ordered into camp and assigned to the Second Brigade, Second Division, Army of Kentucky, General Gordon Granger commanding. December 20, 1862, at Frankfort, the regiment was mounted, and through the following spring and summer the men almost lived in the saddle, scouting, skirmishing, advancing and retreating, capturing John Morgan's men and being in turn captured by them. When Burnside made his advance into

Tennessee the regiment was dismounted and accompanied him, sharing all the terrible hardships which culminated when his forces were shut up in Knoxville, were the men of the Forty-Fourth lay in wet, chilly ditches day and night. After Longstreet's retreat, the regiment camped at Strawberry Plains, and between January 1st and 5th five hundred and fifty of the six hundred men then comprising it re-enlisted. The re-enlistment was accompanied by the promise that they should be armed and mounted as cavalry, and after veteran furlough they returned to service as the

#### EIGHTH OHIO VOLUNTEER CAVALRY.

The arming, equipping and mounting of the regiment was slowly accomplished, but the close of May, 1864, found the new cavalry regiment in motion, armed with the Union carbine and with saddles of the Alleghany pattern, once more traversing the familiar ground, about Lewisburg. Participation in the Lynchburg raid under Hunter, "all fighting and no eating," followed, the Eighth in the saddle almost day and night, and with daily lighting'. Near Liberty, on the retreat, it was ordered to strengthen the rear guard, and became engaged with a brigade of mounted rebels, losing seventy-one killed, wounded and captured. When Lewisburg was reached, the dismounted men were sent to Charleston, the mounted men to Beverly, in Randolph county, West Virginia. August 23d Companies C, H and K, stationed at Huttonsville, were captured. The men were paroled, but their accoutrements and horses carried away. Soon after Company A was captured and the captain and some of the men sent to Richmond prisons. October 29th the camp at Beverly was attacked before daylight, just at roll-call. A lively fight ensued and the rebels were driven. About December 1st Colonel Moore, with his detachment of the regiment, reached Beverly. This detachment had fought at Winchester, Fisher's Hill and Cedar Creek, and pursued Early's retreat, sharing in the glories of Sheridan's campaign of the Shenandoah. January 11, 1865, the enemy succeeded in surprising the post at Beverly, and out of the six companies of the Eighth Cavalry then stationed there twenty-five were killed and wounded, five hundred and seventy-five men and eight officers captured. A forced march of one hundred and sixty two miles to Staunton followed, the prisoners on foot, many of them barefoot, their clothes frozen about them, the snow one to three feet deep, icy, deep streams to wade, and only two days' rations served them in seven days. From Staunton they were sent to the Richmond prisons, most of them to Libby and Pemberton, and subjected to all the abuses we have before described. February 15th they were sent to parole camp at Annapolis, thence to Columbus; some returned to Clarksburg, West Virginia, where those of the regiment who had not been captured were then stationed, and remained there till the regiment was there mustered out, July 31, 1865, receiving discharge at Camp Dennison. Others were discharged as prisoners of war at Camp Chase in June, 1865.

#### THE FORTY-FIFTH OHIO VOLUNTEER INFANTRY.

This regiment was mustered into service at Camp Chase, August 19, 1862. The next day it was ordered to Cynthiana, Kentucky, whence, on the advance of Kirby Smith, it fell back to Covington. After he ceased to menace Cincinnati, it advanced to Lexington, reconstructing bridges along the Kentucky Central Railroad. Its headquarters were Lexington until January 25, 1863, and there it was brigaded under General Green Clay Smith. Ordered to Danville, it was there mounted in February, and brigaded with the Seventh Ohio and Tenth Kentucky Cavalry, Colonel Runkle commanding brigade, and pursued a body of rebel cavalry around Crab Orchard and Mount Sterling, taking part in its first regular engagement at Dutton Hill, near Somerset, March 30th. From that time till July, with headquarters at Somerset, it picketed the line of the Cumberland river. July 4, 1863, it began the chase after John Morgan, from the Cumberland to the Ohio, thence through Indiana and Ohio, after that going to Camp Nelson. When Burnside's army was organized in Kentucky, August, 1863, it was assigned to Byrd's brigade, Carter's division, but after the Tennessee was crossed it was attached to Wolford's cavalry brigade. October 20th this brigade, then stationed at Philadelphia, Tennessee, was surprised by the enemy, its direct retreat cut off, and heavy loss ensued. The Forty-Fifth lost more than one hundred captured, most of whom saw many dreary months imprisonment, which for many ended in death. The regiment shared in Burnside's disastrous entanglement at Knoxville, and after Longstreet's retreat was sent to Cumberland Gap, where it remained till February 8, 1864, then went to Mount Sterling, Kentucky, and was there dismounted. In the Atlanta campaign it

was part of the Second Brigade, Second Division, Twenty-Third Army Corps, fighting at Resaca, Dallas, Lost Mountain, Kenesaw Mountain, New Hope Church, Lovejoy Station, and other points. Late in June it was transferred to the Second Brigade, First Division, Fourth Corps, and was one of the regiments that went back into Tennessee to meet and defeat Hood, engaging at Franklin and Nashville. From April, 1865, till there mustered out, June 15, 1865, its headquarters were Nashville, Tennessee.

#### THE SIXTY-SIXTH OHIO VOLUNTEER INFANTRY.

This regiment rendezvoused at Camp McArthur, near Urbana, countyseat of Champaign county, in the closing months of 1861, and broke camp January 17, 1862, under orders to report to General Lander, then guarding the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad, in West Virginia, with headquarters at New Creek. Its first campaigning was in the movement against Romney, early in February, 1862, a rough taste of soldier life, fording icy streams, and camping without tents or blankets in snow six inches deep. Its next service was under General Shields in the Shenandoah valley, and included guard and provost duty at Martinsburg, Winchester, Strasburg, with much marching and countermarching through the valley, and across the Blue Ridge. June 9, 1862, it was engaged at Port Republic. In July it reported to General Pope, and was assigned to Geary's brigade, Augur's division, and took part in the campaign of Pope's "Army of Virginia," losing eighty-seven killed and wounded at Cedar Mountain out of two hundred under arms. It was also engaged at second Bull Run and at Antietam. Its last engagement in 1862 was at Dumfries, Virginia, where it was on garrison duty, and where seven hundred of our men repulsed two thousand Confederates. In 1862 it was engaged at Chancellorsville, at Gettysburg, then, having bade adieu to the Army of the Potomac, and joined the Army of the Cumberland, at Lookout Mountain, Missionary Ridge and Ringgold. In December the majority of the regiment veteraned, and on returning to the front were three months in camp at Bridgeport, Alabama. In the Atlanta campaign, a part of the First Brigade, Second Division, Twentieth Corps, it followed Hooker on the battlefields of Rocky Face Ridge, Resaca, Pumpkinvine Creek, Pine Mountain, Culps Farm, Kenesaw, Marietta, Peachtree Creek, the assaults on Atlanta. It shared in the March to the Sea, the Carolina campaign, was reviewed at Washington, and received final discharge at Columbus, July 19, 1865. Its original muster was nine hundred and eighty men, its recruits were three hundred and seventy, it lost in killed one hundred and ten, in wounded three hundred and fifty-eight, took part in eighteen battles, served in twelve States, and marched over a thousand miles. The roster of this regiment and its casualties are fully given on previous pages. The battles in which it took such gallant part are presented in connection with the history of the campaigns of which they were a part, in this work.

#### THE SEVENTY-FIRST OHIO VOLUNTEER INFANTRY

Numbered in its ranks some of the most gallant of the volunteers of 1861. The organization of the regiment was completed at Troy, Miami county, about the 1st of February, 1862. On St. Valentines Day the regiment reported to General Sherman, at Paducah, Kentucky, and plunged zealously into the study of military tactics, attaining a proficiency in drill in a very short time. In the advance up the Tennessee the Seventy-First, Colonel Rodney Mason commanding, was transported on the steamers "Ocean" and "Hazel Dell," and its men were among the first to debark at Pittsburg Landing. It was gallantly engaged in both days fighting at Shiloh, its loss, as previously stated, in both days reaching the terrible total of 130 killed and wounded. The service of the regiment through the campaigning of 1862 was principally in Middle Tennessee, and included its unfortunate surrender at Clarksville, August 18th. Early in 1863 it took part in an expedition against the forces of Wheeler and Forrest, but the retreat of the Confederates prevented an engagement. The latter part of the year the companies of the regiment were stationed at various points along the Louisville & Nashville R. R., with headquarters at Gallatin, Tennessee, and constant encounters with guerrilla forces made this duty both exciting and dangerous. The opening of the year 1864 witnessed the re-enlistment of the majority of the regiment, and the year closed with its participation in the battle of Nashville, December 15-16, in which, displaying great bravery, it lost one third of its number. Through 1865 its service was garrison duty in Texas, and the war had long been practically closed before it was relieved from duty. At San Antonio, Texas, November 30, 1865, the men were mustered out, and they



received final discharge at Columbus, on the 6th of January, 1866.

#### THE NINETY-FOURTH OHIO VOLUNTEER INFANTRY.

This regiment was organized at Camp Piqua, Miami county, in July and August, 1862, under supervision of its first colonel, Joseph W. Frizell. He resigned command February 22, 1863, and was succeeded by Colonel Stephen A. Bassett, who resigned April 16, 1864. At muster-out the regiment was commanded by Lieutenant-Colonel R. P. Hutchins. August 28, 1862, without uniform or camp equipage, and never having drilled as a regiment, the Ninety-Fourth was ordered to Kentucky, to assist in repelling Kirby Smith's threatened approach on Cincinnati. Arrived at Cincinnati, it was ordered to Lexington, Kentucky, and with three rounds of cartridge to the man and a very limited amount of army clothing, started for that place, which was reached at 9 P.M. on Saturday. The town was filling with stragglers from the battle-field of Richmond, Kentucky, and the colonel of the Ninety-Fourth found no accommodations for his men, and the officer to whom he was to report was so far intoxicated he could neither rise from his bed nor give him any intelligent instructions. Under these auspices, the boys of the Ninety-Fourth made their first bivouac as best they might. The next morning an order was received for the regiment to proceed to Yates Ford, fifteen miles east of Lexington, on the Richmond road. The order was a blunder, and was one that might well have appalled a veteran organization, but the raw troops obeyed without a murmur, taking the dry and dusty road and tramping over it without sufficient water to drink till they reached the ford in the dusk of evening. It was their first march, and the exhausted men dropped on the ground everywhere as soon as the halt was called. Almost immediately a fire was opened on them by rebel scouts concealed in the thickets skirting the road. Again the men of the regiment conducted themselves with the steadiness of veterans, falling quietly and quickly into line to repel the anticipated assault. It did not come, the rebels not taking advantage of their first fire, but retreating to Kirby Smith's main line, which was camped only a couple of miles north of the ford. The Ninety-Fourth lost two men killed and six wounded in this, their first meeting with the enemy, three days after they left Ohio. The night passed without further alarm, and in the morning the half-famished men gathered around the supply wagons that had arrived during the night, to find they contained one hundred and twenty-five rounds of ammunition to the man and three sacks of green coffee. The order to fall back to Lexington was gladly received, and was executed by another day's marching on the part of the hungry and thirsty men, many of whom straggled from the line, fell by the wayside, and were captured. Arrived at Lexington, they found our forces were in retreat to Louisville, and that all stores which they had not taken with them were destroyed. The footsore, exhausted men of the Ninety-Fourth were obliged to continue their retreat without needed refreshments. Arrived at Versailles at daylight, a halt for breakfast was ordered, but just as the coffee began to boil (coffee and crackers was all they had to breakfast on, and all they had had for three days), the order to fall in was received. A day of unparalleled suffering ensued. The march began at three in the morning and continued until late at night. The dust was ankle deep in the road; through the day a burning sun shone on them. A few hard crackers were the only rations. For drink, many a soldier gave five dollars for a canteen of muddy water, others drank, from stagnant pools the horses refused to touch. Arrived at Louisville, the Ninety-Fourth went into camp in the woods without tents. They had marched almost night and day for seven days, deprived of sufficient sleep, food and water, and this was their initiation into the life of a soldier. The first report of the adjutant showed a loss of two hundred and eighteen men. The most of these were captured, and were paroled and ultimately rejoined the regiment. When the movement began which resulted in driving Bragg from Kentucky, the Ninety-Fourth was assigned to Rosseau's Division of McCook's Corps. In the battle of Perryville it bore a prominent part. It took position between the Second and Thirty-Third Ohio regiments, and withstood the heaviest shock of the battle, receiving special complimentary mention in general orders for gallantry on that field. In the Stone River battle it was every day engaged, and maintained its reputation for gallantry and intrepidity. In Rosecrans' campaign from Murfreesboro to Tullahoma it fought at Hoovers Gap and at Dug Gap. It fought at Chickamauga, at Lookout Mountain, at Missionary Ridge, in the latter battle taking part in the grand charge which swept our lines over the mountain ridge, and hurled the enemy into the valley below. Through Sherman's victorious campaigns of 1864 it bore its part, fighting at Buzzards Roost, Resaca, Kingston, Pumpkinvine

Creek, Kenesaw Mountain, the Chattahoochee, Peachtree Creek, before Atlanta, and at Jonesboro. It shared in the March to the Sea, and in 1865 in the march through South and North Carolina. It participated in Sherman's last great battle, Bentonville, and was the first regiment of infantry to enter Raleigh, the capital of North Carolina. It marched to Washington, via Richmond and Alexandria, participated in the grand review, and was mustered out at Washington, June 5-6, 1865, with 338 men in the ranks, ranks that had left Ohio not quite three years before 1,010 strong. The regiment was disbanded at Columbus June 15, 1865.

#### THE NINETY-FIFTH OHIO VOLUNTEER INFANTRY.

This regiment was mustered into service at Camp Chase on the 19th of August, 1862, and discharged there exactly three years from that date. In that time, of the 1,085 officers and men whose names had appeared on its rolls, 528 had been killed or died in service of wounds or disease. Small need to say how hard had been its service, when its record presents such figures as these. It took the field at Lexington, Kentucky, and inauspiciously began its career by a forced march to Richmond, Kentucky, and a battle there against desperate odds, in which the raw troops of the Ninety-Fifth, forgetting that discretion said to be the better part of valor, stood their ground till they were completely surrounded and forced to surrender. The loss of the regiment was eight killed, forty-seven wounded, six hundred captured. The men were paroled on the field, and their exchange was effected in November, 1862. May 25, 1863, the re-organized regiment was ordered to Memphis, and there it was brigaded in Sherman's division, and moved to take part in the Vicksburg campaign, then with him to Chattanooga. In the winter of 1863-4 it was attached to the Sixteenth Corps, and so served till ordered home. In June, 1864, it moved in Sturgis' ill-fated expedition to Tupelo, and at Brices Cross Roads, near Guntown, June 10th, thanks to the blundering of that incompetent general, who formed his line of battle obliquely to the enemy's approach, so that they could come upon his infantry regiments and crush them successively, while he could not use his artillery at all, the Ninety-Fifth again came to grief, losing more than half its force, killed, wounded and captured. Those of the regiment still left for duty had the pleasure of sharing in General A. J. Smith's better-planned expedition to Tupelo, during which they helped to whip Forrest not once but twice. A chase after Price into Arkansas and Missouri was then indulged in, and after his forces had been scattered in Arkansas the regiment moved to assist Thomas in repelling Hood's advance on Nashville. In March, 1865, it reported to General Canby at New Orleans, and assisted in the reduction of Mobile, the storming of Fort Blakeley and Spanish Fort, the last battles of the war.

#### THE ONE HUNDRED AND TENTH OHIO VOLUNTEER INFANTRY.

This regiment was organized at Camp Piqua, Miami county, October 3, 1862, moved by rail to Zanesville October 19th, thence by steamer to Marietta, from thence to Parkersburg, West Virginia, by rail, thence to Clarksburg, thence to New Creek. It remained in camp at New Creek, fortifying, drilling, and performing guard and picket duty until December 13th, when it was transferred to Moorefield, West Virginia. From that point three hundred of the regiment moved in the direction of Winchester, the remainder toward Romney. The regiment re-united at Winchester about January 1, 1863, and was there assigned to the First Brigade, Second Division, Eighth Army Corps. Detachments of the regiment took part in the expeditions to Front Royal, Summit Point and New Market. In Milroy's three days' fighting at Kernstown and Winchester, June 13-15th, the regiment was actively engaged. This was its first regular battle, and its loss was very heavy. On the 13th it was pressed back from the vicinity of Kernstown by Lee's advance troops, and disputed every inch of the ground with desperate valor. On the morning of the 14th it occupied a slight earthwork, about three-quarters of a mile from the main fort. In the afternoon the enemy opened on this with twenty-six pieces of artillery, and then advanced in strong columns to assault. The regiment held the works till driven out at the point of the bayonet by overwhelming odds. During the succeeding night it had another two hours' engagement with the enemy. In these three days fighting many of the regiment were captured. The men of the line as a rule were paroled after thirty to forty five days in Richmond prisons, but most of the officers captured saw many weary months imprisonment. June 16th the regiment crossed the Potomac, and camped at Maryland Heights, thence by Georgetown, Tennallytown and

Washington to Frederick City, Maryland, where it was re-brigaded in the Second Brigade, Third Division, Third Corps, Army of the Potomac. It pursued Lee as far as the Rappahannock in his retreat into Virginia, skirmishing at Manassas Gap. At Alexandria it took steamship "Mississippi" for New York, and until September it camped at Governors Island and Carroll Park, South Brooklyn. September 6th it returned to Virginia, where its first service was to guard an ammunition train from Fox Ford to Culpeper. Its further service in 1863 was in Virginia, and it was engaged near the Rappahannock, at Brandy Station, and at Locust Grove. December 3d it made winter quarters at Brandy Station. In March, 1864, it was made a part of the Second Brigade, Third Division, Sixth Army Corps, and fought at the Wilderness, at Spotsylvania C. H., at Cold Harbor, and before Petersburg. In July it embarked on the "City of Albany" for Baltimore, and there took cars for Monocacy, where it took part in the battle of that name, and aided in checking Early's movement toward Washington. Its next service was in the Shenandoah valley, and included skirmishing and fighting at Charlestown, Winchester, Cedar Creek and other points. In November, 1864, the men built winter quarters near Kernstown, but were not privileged to occupy them long. On December 3d they were again in motion, and by cars and steamer were transferred to a line east of the Weldon Railroad, where winter quarters were again built. February 9, 1865, the regiment took position between Forts Fisher and Welch, and a third time erected winter quarters. March 26th and April 2cl it was in action before Petersburg, and in the pursuit of Lee engaged the enemy at Sailors Creek. April 17th, at the presentation of the captured flags to General Meade, the One Hundred and Tenth, having captured more flags than any other regiment in the corps, was selected as a guard of honor to escort them to General Meade's headquarters. It was reviewed at Richmond by General Halleck, took part in the grand review at Washington, and was there mustered out, June 25, 1865. It had shared in twenty-one engagements, and lost in killed, wounded and captured seven hundred and ninety-five men.

#### THE ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTEENTH OHIO VOLUNTEER INFANTRY.

Seven companies of this regiment were organized at Camp Chase, in August and the early fall of 1862; one company was added at Camp Zanesville, one at Camp Dennison, and on December 27th the new regiment was ordered to Louisville, Kentucky, in and around which place its quarters were until ordered to Nashville, early in 1863. Inadequate means of transportation caused much sickness to result from this movement. At Franklin, Tennessee, the regiment became a part of General C. C. Gilbert's division, which was a part of Rosecrans' right wing of the Army of the Cumberland, and shared with it in the Tullahoma campaign. In the Chattanooga campaign it was a part of Granger's Reserve Corps, and shared the glories of that corps on Chickamauga field, with the loss of 138 out of 382 engaged. Its division, the Second of the Fourteenth Corps, was detached from its corps to support Sherman in Missionary Ridge battle, and it was under fire during that engagement. It engaged in the subsequent pursuit of the enemy, and fought with some loss at Stuarts Creek. It shared in the sufferings of those troops that moved to the relief of Burnside at Knoxville, the men marching without blankets, many without shoes, all with insufficient clothing and food. Winter quarters were established at McAfees Church, eight miles south of Chattanooga. On New Years eve, 1863-4, it was sent on advance outpost duty, and the suffering of the men through that intensely cold night, while they were entirely shelterless, will never be forgotten by any one of them. The regiment shared in the Atlanta campaign, the March to the Sea, the campaign of the Carolinas, in the grand review at Washington, and was mustered out at Louisville, Kentucky, July 6, 1865, discharged at Columbus.

#### THE ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-SIXTH REGIMENT.

This regiment was recruited for the four-month service in Clarke, Warren and Lawrence counties, and the men were mustered into service at Camp Dennison, May 12, 1864. Five days later it was ordered to Charleston, West Virginia. From that point Companies A and H were detailed to guard three hundred captured "Johnnies" to safe quarters at Camp Chase. May 23d the regiment moved for Fayetteville, West Virginia, where it gave efficient service on garrison duty in a country swarming with Union haters till ordered, August 27th, to Camp Piatt. Thence it returned to Camp Dennison, where the men were discharged September 7, 1864.

#### THE ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SECOND REGIMENT.

Two companies of the Thirty-Fifth Regiment, O. N. G., from Clarke county, were mustered into the National service at Camp Dennison in the One Hundred and Fifty-Second Regiment. The remainder of the regiment was filled from Darke county. After muster it was sent, via Grafton, West Virginia, to New Creek. It camped there, performing guard duty at the government ware-house, and picket duty in the surrounding mountains. From New Creek it moved to Martinsburg, and on June 4th started for the front, guarding a train of one hundred and ninety-nine wagons. June 27th it reached Beverly, having marched four hundred and thirty miles in twenty-three days, and sustained two attacks from the enemy, one near Sweet Springs, one six miles from White Springs, with slight loss. June 18th the regiment destroyed a railroad bridge and depot and seventy-five stand of arms. The next day the property at Grace Iron Works was destroyed. After a couple of days rest at Beverly the regiment was sent to Cumberland, Maryland, where detachments were sent to various points for guard duty. The regiment re assembled at Cumberland the last of July, and remained there till ordered home. Seventy sick men of the regiment arrived at Camp Dennison August 14th, the remainder August 28th. It was mustered out at Camp Dennison September 2, 1864, and received pay and final discharge September 5th.

#### THE ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-THIRD REGIMENT.

This four month regiment was composed mainly of Clarke county men, who had been for some months in the O. N. G. service, was mustered into service at Camp Dennison on May 12, 1864. It took the field at Harpers Ferry, West Virginia, which was its headquarters through May and June, its companies during that time engaged in guard duty along the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad. Late in June it was ordered to report to General Butler at Bermuda Hundred, and in his department was actively engaged in guard and picket duty till the close of its service. A part of the regiment was under fire at North River Mills, July 3, 1864, with a loss of several killed and wounded. At the close of its service it was ordered to Camp Chase, where the men were paid and discharged.

#### THE SIXTEENTH OHIO BATTERY

[Kindly furnished by a member.]

Was organized August 20, 1861, and numbered, including officers, one hundred and sixty-six men. Left Springfield, Ohio, September 5th, arriving at Cincinnati the same evening, where it was mustered into the service of the United States by Captain Lew. Wilson, of the regular army. Left Cincinnati same evening, and arrived at St. Louis on the 7th. Departed from St. Louis for Jefferson City, October 15th, arriving same day. Remained at Jefferson City until February 16, 1862, receiving guns and harness meanwhile. Left Jefferson City February 16th; returned to St. Louis and went into quarters at Benton Barracks. Remained there until March 8th, then left for Pilot Knob, Missouri, arriving same day. Departed from Pilot Knob March 23d, and halting five days at Reems Station, arrived at Doniphan, Missouri, April 1st. A small rebel force was in the immediate vicinity, but retreated on our approach, only to return and shoot our pickets. But a thorough shelling of the woods from the battery put an end to all such demonstrations. Left Doniphan April 16th, arriving at Pocahontas, Arkansas, April 21st. Here the Confederates withdrew as we approached, as at Doniphan. Left Pocahontas April 30th, and arrived at Jacksonport May 4th. Left with four guns for Batesville May 21st, Lieutenant Twist with two guns remaining at Jacksonport. Arrived at Batesville May 22d, and were rejoined by Lieutenant Twist with his section June 15th. Left Batesville with the Army of the Southwest June 22d, and then commenced one of the severest marches on record in midsummer. Water difficult to obtain, and when procured unfit to use, often without rations, blinded with dust on the hot roads, or knee-deep in mud in the swamps, General Curtis and his gallant army pressed onward, arriving at Helena on the 13th of July. The advance of the army was almost continually skirmishing with the enemy, and in an engagement at Cottonplant, on the 7th of July, the Confederate loss was one hundred and forty killed; ours but seven killed and thirty wounded. Remaining at Helena until July 21st, to recruit the exhausted energies of the men after their long and fatiguing march, the battery moved to Old Town landing, a point on the Mississippi twenty miles below Helena. While

there many of the men became unfit for duty, from the use of bad water and the unhealthy location of the camp. Returned to Helena August 13th, and for three months afterward every tent in the camp was a hospital, and at one time we had but twenty men for duty. The battery accompanied two expeditions up White river from Helena, the first a failure from low water; the second, which proceeded up as far as Duvalls Bluff, was successful in accomplishing its object; suffered much from cold and exposure, and embarked on transport at Helena, April 12th, and landed at Millikens Bend, Louisiana, April 15th. Joined General Grant's army, marched with it through Louisiana, and crossed the Mississippi at Bruinsburg on the evening of April 30th, having marched since 3 A. M.; halted an hour to rest men and horses, then pressed onward again, for the sound of distant cannonading indicated work in front. Arrived in the vicinity of the battle field of Port Gibson about 10 A. M. May 1st. Rested about an hour, then went forward at a brisk trot to join our brigade, that had been engaged since morning. Found them about two miles to the front, took position on a hill commanding a fine view of the enemy's position, and fought them for ten hours, expending three hundred and fifty rounds of ammunition. As night closed around the two armies the enemy retreated and we lay down around our guns well satisfied with our day's work and the prospect of a night's rest, the first for forty hours. Resuming our march the next morning, pressed the enemy hard, and skirmished with them for six hours at Fourteen Mile creek on the 12th without loss, expending one hundred rounds. May 16th fought the battle of Champion Hill. Here Captain James A. Mitchell was mortally wounded. Being hard pressed by superior numbers and compelled to fall back, he was the last to leave the field, and fell pierced through the left side by a minie-ball. After regaining possession of the ground where he fell, he was removed to the hospital, but died next morning. Battery was hotly engaged for six hours, and expended two hundred and twenty-five rounds of ammunition. Took position in the rear of Vicksburg on the night of the 21st of May. The battery occupied one of the most important points on the line, and protected only by a slight earth work and exposed to a continual fire from the rebel sharpshooters, did good execution during the terrible charge of the 22d and throughout the siege, expending six thousand five hundred and ninety four rounds of ammunition; dismounted seven guns in different works of the enemy, with a loss of but two wounded. Captain R. P. Twist was in command of the battery at this time, and it had the honor of throwing the last shot into Vicksburg from the land batteries. Left Vicksburg for Jackson, Mississippi, on the 5th of July, and arrived in front of its fortifications July 11th. Under fire for five days without loss; expended two hundred and five rounds. Departed from Jackson July 21st, and arrived at Vicksburg on the 23d, suffering much on the route from excessive heat, dust and the scarcity of water. Left Vicksburg on board transport August 8th, arriving at Port Hudson August 10th. Left Port Hudson August 18th, and arrived at Carrollton, Louisiana, August 20th. Left Carrollton November 7th, and arrived at Brashear City, Louisiana, on the 8th. The battery had expended since it had been in service seven thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven rounds, or about fifty tons of ammunition; had traveled by rail about one thousand miles and by river one thousand eight hundred, and had marched through the States of Missouri, Arkansas, Mississippi and Louisiana, in all a distance of about one thousand miles, an aggregate of three thousand eight hundred miles.

In December, 1863, the majority of the men re-enlisted to see the war through, and it was the first organization in the Department of the Gulf mustered into veteran service. January 1, 1864, it embarked on the steamer "Alabama" for Texas, and was landed in the Matagorda Peninsula after the roughest kind of a voyage. Its service in Texas was on Matagorda Peninsula, Matagorda Island, Indianola and Powderhorn, until, in June, it was sent to New Orleans. The men had never received veteran furlough, on the ground that the services of the battery were indispensable, but in the summer of 1864 they were furloughed in two successive detachments, thus keeping the battery in constant service. It was refitted at New Orleans, new guns, carriages and harness; and saw the brightest side of soldiering there till ordered home, July 13, 1865. It was disbanded after its glorious service by the discharge of the men at Camp Chase, September 5, 1865.

#### THE SEVENTEENTH OHIO INDEPENDENT BATTERY

Was organized at Dayton, Montgomery county, by Captain A. A. Blount, under special authority from the President, dated July 12, 1862. It was mustered into service at Dayton, August 21, 1862, and equipped at

Cincinnati, entering the field in Kentucky, taking a position in the rear of Covington on the 3d day of September, near Fort Wallace. Kirby Smith finding discretion the better part of valor and retreating from his threatened attack on Cincinnati, it was a part of the force marched to Lexington and Louisville. From the latter place it was sent to Memphis to join the troops gathering there to move under General Sherman. The roll of the battles in which it subsequently took gallant part shows how valuable was its service in the field : The five days' fighting at Chickasaw Bayou, December 25, 1862, to January 1, 1863 ; Arkansas Post, January 11, 1863 ; Port Gibson, May 1, 1863 ; Champion Hills, May 16, 1863; Black River Bridge, May 17, 1863 ; siege of Vicksburg, May 19 to July 4, 1863 ; siege of Jackson, July 10 to July 17, 1863 ; Grand Coteau, Louisiana, November 3, 1863 ; Fort Morgan, Alabama, August 16 to August 22, 1864 ; Fort Blakely (one of the two last of the war), April 7 to 9, 1865. In this participation in ten battles and sieges the Seventeenth Battery tired thirteen thousand round of ammunition, moved by land and water more than ten thousand miles, and lost forty men. It was one of the Ohio organizations to receive the thanks of the people it represented, through joint resolution of the Ohio legislature, for services at Arkansas Post. After the surrender of Fort Blakely, it was sent to Montgomery, Alabama, where it was stationed till ordered to Ohio for muster out, August 16, 1865. The roll of engagements of this battery is kindly furnished by Emanuel Mitzel, who was a participant in all the battles mentioned.

The rosters on preceding pages show the number of volunteers Clarke county furnished the Nation during the four years of the civil war. The enlistments began under the first call for troops in April, 1861, in the Second, Third and Sixteenth three-month regiments; recruiting went on through every day of those fearful months, and was still in progress when the order to cease recruiting followed the surrender of Lee's Arm of Northern Virginia at Appomattox C. H., Virginia. Volunteers from the county helped to swell the ranks of the Thirty-Second, Thirty-Fifth, Fifty-Second, Sixtieth, Seventy-Eighth, One Hundred and Twenty-Eighth, One Hundred and Twenty-Ninth, and other Ohio infantry regiments, as well as those already mentioned. They were found in the Naval service, from the Atlantic coast along the Gulf and up the Mississippi and Red rivers; in cavalry service in the First, Fourth, Fifth, Tenth and other regiments of Ohio cavalry, as well as independent organizations; in the artillery independent batteries, and in the three regiments of light and heavy artillery raised. To enumerate the services of these regiments here would be to repeat records already given in these pages. Our Roll of Honor connects these soldiers with their regiments, and the services of the regiments has already been made a part of the Military History of Ohio on preceding pages. Among the honored residents of Clarke county today are those who took the field in defense of the Union from Massachusetts, New York, Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, Iowa, Illinois, and from almost every loyal State of the Union.

An eulogy of the services of Clarke county soldiers in the defense of the Nation, and for the perpetuity of its institutions, is not necessary. The graves of those who marched from the county and fell at Shiloh, at Stone River, at Antietam, at Gettysburg, in the battles of the Vicksburg campaign, at Chickamauga, before Atlanta, at Franklin, at Nashville, in the marshes of the Mississippi, among the mountains and in the valleys of the Virginias, on the Atlantic slope, in the prison pens of Libby, Belle Isle, Andersonville, Columbia, Cahaba, Macon, Millen: these be witnesses. The battle-torn flags borne and defended by its soldiers, the battle-scarred veterans who came marching home when the War was ended: these be witnesses!

[The valuable addition to the war literature of Clarke County, contained in the following record of the soldiers in the Wars of 1776 and 1812 and the Mexican War, is kindly furnished the publishers by FLETCHER WHITE, Esq., of Springfield.]

#### CLARKE COUNTY SOLDIERS, WARS OF 1776 AND 1812.

Many of the 4,000 soldiers who went from Clarke County and served in the war of the rebellion, 1861-5, were descendants of those who served in the patriot army during the war of the revolution and of those who served in the American army during the last war with England.

The county was named in honor of Gen. George Rodgers Clarke, the commander of the colonial forces in the western territories during the revolutionary war. Assisted by the brave men under him, his victories in

1779, over the combined English and Indian forces at Kahokia and Vincennes, secured to Virginia, and ultimately, by cession of Virginia, to the United States, the whole of the northwestern territory, and by his victory over the Indians under Tecumseh and Simon Girty in August, 1780, at the "Old Piqua" battle ground on Mad river, in this county, the fertile valleys of Ohio were opened to settlement by the hardy pioneers of that day.

General Clarke was born in Virginia, in 1752, took an active part in the old French and Indian wars, and came to Kentucky about 1775, and was soon thereafter placed in command of the military forces in the then territory, and continued in such command until after peace with England was declared. He then settled at Louisville, where he died about 1818.

Simon Kenton, who lived in this county for years, served with and under General Clarke, as also did General Duncan McArthur whose descendants live here now. Wm. D. Baird, of Harmony township, is a son of Wm. Baird a soldier of the revolutionary war, who came to this county in 1808, and died here in 1836.

Merrifield Vicory, of Springfield township, was a drummer boy in the revolutionary war. Andrew Pinneo, of Springfield township, was a soldier in that war. These are the only names that we have been able to obtain of those who became citizens of Clarke county who served in that war; doubtless there were others. Clarke county was not organized until December, 1817, being until 1800, a part of Hamilton county, and from then until 1805, a part of Greene county, and from 1805 to 1817, a part of Champaign county. Under the militia law in force during the war of 1812, the State of Ohio was divided into five military divisions; Champaign county was included in the fifth division, and the militia of Champaign and Greene counties composed the first brigade of that (fifth) division. In March, 1812, during the siege of Fort Meigs, and again in 1813, the whole militia of the State were called out for short terms of service; perhaps not less than 25,000 of the militia and regular troops from the State served during the war of 1812, and it is estimated that from the territory now comprising Clarke county, as many as 500 (counting double enlistments) were in that service; but unfortunately, the muster rolls have not been preserved, and it is only by patient and most laborious research that the following list of names of those who served in that war has been obtained. It is thought to be a correct, but by no means complete, list of the soldiers of 1812.

The number of widows of soldiers of 1812 now living in this county, so far as could be learned, is sixteen. It is now seventy years since the war of 1812 closed. How many of the four thousand comrades from this county who served in the war of the rebellion will be alive seventy years after its close in 1865? or fifty years hence? This question forces its way into our minds, and will more frequently as time goes by.

#### WAR WITH MEXICO, 1846-7.

This war was not popular with the people of Clarke county, and consequently but few entered that service, in all not to exceed eight or ten men. Of those the following names have been obtained: Andrew F. Boggs, Biddle Boggs, Edward Boggs, George Cox, Isaiah Cheney, Daniel Harsh, Adam Evans and one Hoover. Captain Simon H. Drum, of the United States Army, was brought here for burial, he having been killed during the assault upon the City of Mexico. Vincent Nowotny was a soldier in this war, and helped to bear Captain Drum from the field. Nowotny afterwards became a citizen of Springfield.

#### CLARKE COUNTY G. A. R. POSTS, DEPARTMENT OF OHIO.

"To perpetuate the memory of those who have fallen, and to care for the widows and orphans of our dead comrades."

#### MITCHELL POST, NO. 45,

Chartered February 18, 1881, and located at Springfield, Ohio, was named in honor of Captain James A. Mitchell, of the 16th Ohio Battery, who was killed at battle of Champion Hill, Mississippi, May 16, 1863-Vicksburg campaign.

Captain Mitchell came from a fighting family, his ancestors on both sides having served in the wars of the Revolution and of 1812. He was the oldest son of Archibald and Sarah Mitchell, born in Bethel township, Clarke county, Ohio, October 30, 1824. Attended the common schools of the county until he was nineteen years of age, and then prepared himself for college under Rev. E. R. Johnson, of New Carlisle, and entered the preparatory department of Wittenburg College, of Springfield, in November, 1845, and remained in college until 1850, when the gold excitement drew him to California, where he remained until 1855, mining and farming. He then returned to Clarke county, and for next two years was engaged in selling trees. Then he resumed his legal studies under direction of Judge William Rodgers, of Springfield, attending the Cincinnati Law College under Hon. Bellamy Storer, and in 1858 was admitted to the bar and entered into a partnership with General Charles Anthony, a distinguished lawyer and politician of

Springfield. Remained in the practice until the breaking out of the war in 1861, having a good practice and bright prospects for the future.

In July, 1861, together with Lieutenants Twist, Funston, Murdock, and I. N. Mitchell, his brother, he raised the Sixteenth Battery Light Artillery, which was organized on Clarke county fair grounds, August 20, 1861; mustered into the United States service September 5, 1861. The battery in 1861-62 was in department of Mississippi. In 1862 joined General Curtis' army in Arkansas. In 1863 was in Vicksburg campaign, where at the battle of Champion Hills, May 16th, Captain Mitchell was shot through the body, falling into the hands of the enemy, but was afterwards recovered same day, and died that night, and was buried on the field, at the age of thirty-nine years. In 1858 he married, at Louisville, Kentucky, a Miss Jennie Stuckey, who survives him with two sons. Captain Mitchell's father, Archibald Mitchell, served in the war of 1812 as a member of Captain Samuel Black's company, Second Regiment Ohio Militia, Colonel John Daugherty, from Clarke county, Ohio, commanding. His maternal grandfather, Swygert, was in the battle of Cowpens, North Carolina, war of Revolution, and served during most of the seven years of that war.

#### Sons of Veterans

Z. Barney Phillips Camp, No. 37, mustered July 28, 1884, by Past Commander Wm. H. Grant, of Mitchell Post, No.45, Grand Army of Republic. Z. Barney Phillips enlisted on the 26th of August, 1862, at New York, in Company I, One Hundred and Twelfth New York Volunteer Infantry, as private ; was in hospital at Hampton for spinal meningitis, July, 1863 ; was transferred on March 31, 1864, Thirty-First Regiment, Second Battalion, Veteran Reserve Corps, at Hampton, Virginia, where he was hospital steward, and had charge of wounded ; was discharged May 27, 1865, from United States general hospital, Fortress Monroe, Virginia, on surgeon's certificate; his discharge was made out on May 24, 1865, and he died May 24, 1879, just fourteen years after, at Springfield, Ohio.

#### POWELL POST, NO. 381.

This Post was organized at Tremont City, on the 11th of October, 1883. In Tremont City, October 15, 1842, was born William Albert, son of Benjamin and Elvira Powell. His first school days were passed in the place of his birth, then he attended school for a time at Springfield. He clerked in a grocery store there for a time, and had started to learn the carriage making trade, when the war broke out. But a few months

over eighteen years of age, yet he was an ardent patriot, and answered the first call for troops for the three-year service, enlisting at Springfield. His father insisted on removing him from the service, and the boypatriot went to Urbana, and there enlisted again in October, 1861, Company B, Sixty-Sixth Ohio Volunteer Infantry. He was one of the many of that regiment whose lives were offered on the altar of their country's need in the battle of Cedar Mountain, Virginia, August 9, 1862, where he fell among the killed, face to the foe. Comrades who keep green his memory have named Post No. 381, in his honor. His remains were interred among the "unknown," in the National Cemetery, at Culpeper, Virginia.
