

Associations Category – Raup Family Collection

The Raup Family Collection was donated to the Clark County Historical Society by Elizabeth Raup in 2003. The collection consists of numerous essays presented at meetings of the Young Men's Literary Club, many items associated with other local associations and charities that the Raups were involved with, family obituary, correspondences, newspaper clippings, photographs, and church celebration programs.

The collection is primarily contained in two legal size Hollinger boxes, one being designated as a biographical category and one classified as an association category. The biographical box contains 18 file folders in one series. The associations box contains 31 files in four series, as follows:

- Series 1: Programs from the Young Men's Literary Club
- Series 2: Essays presented by George S. Raup
- Series 3: Essays presented by George B. Raup
- Series 4: Essays delivered by others or authorship unknown

There are no restrictions on the use of this collection.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

In addition to the processing decisions made for the whole collection (reference Biographical Category, Raup Family Collection PC003.55), this box presented certain challenges because the essays arrived without clear indication of authorship and date of presentation. The Young Men's Literary Club programs from 1899 through 1978 provided information on both and are noted on the files in brackets ([]).

Series 1 consists of two file folders of programs of the Young Men's Literary Club from 1899 through 1978. There is also a newspaper clipping dated February 22, 1924.

Series 2 consists of 21 file folders of essays presented by George S. Raup. His essays range over a wide variety of topics and he seems to have presented every two years beginning in 1919 and ending in 1966.

Series 3 consists of three file folders of essays presented by George Bryant Raup beginning in 1964. The last essay has no date attached to it.

Series 4 consists of 5 file folders of essays whose authorship and date of presentation are uncertain and essays by other Club members.
