Ark/Peairs Family Collection

Introduction

The Ark and Peairs Family Collection consists of artifacts and archival papers donated to the Clark County Historical Society at multiple times between 2004 and 2020 by Shirley and Patti Ark. The items donated document the lives of several members of these two families who lived all or a large part of their lives in Clark County, Ohio and were involved in a wide range of activities and significant events within the community.

The bulk of the artifacts and archival papers were consolidated into the Ark/Peairs Family Collection. However, some artifacts and archival papers of a general nature are stored in their respective designated areas within the museum.

The collection consists of seven boxes. There are three white and one gray Hollinger boxes, along with three oversized gray Gaylord boxes. The collection contains a wide variety of materials including photographs, scrapbooks, school papers, club memberships and military and banking records. The collection was divided into 12 series.

Biographical/Historical

Ark Family History:

The earliest member of the Ark family to reside in Clark County was Casper Ark. He was born in Saxe Coburg, Germany in 1834 and came to America in 1868. Casper was listed in the 1870 census as a boarder in the 3rd Ward in Springfield and worked as a laborer. He married Maria Claybaugh in 1873. They had four sons. The Agricultural Census of 1880 showed Casper owned farmland in Mad River Township.

It was through their third son, Edward Jonah Ark, who was born March 6, 1878 in Clark County that the family expands and becomes involved in the history and development of Clark County. Edward married Nora Elizabeth (Lizzie) Mitman on October 2, 1901. She was born March 2, 1885 also in Clark County and was the oldest of 13. Edward and Lizzie had 11 children between 1902 and 1930. The family were tenant farmers and moved from farm to farm throughout Clark County primarily in the Enon area.

Four of the 11 children (Roy, Harry, Fanny and Bill) enlisted in World War II along with a couple of their Uncles (Lizzie's younger brothers), one future brother-in-law, one grandson and one grandson-in-law. Having a large family resulted in multiple generations growing up, playing sports and going to school, work and war at the same time in Clark County.

Harry A. Ark was the middle of the 11 children. He was born September 25, 1917 and he grew up on multiple farms in and around Enon. He graduated from Mad River Township High School in 1935 and spent his working years as an employee and officer of the First National Bank, which over the years became BancOhio, National City and now PNC. Harry started as a Messenger and retired after 43 years as Vice President and Secretary of the Board of Directors. It was during these years that he met and helped people from all walks-of-life to meet their financial needs and became committed to doing community service.

During his early years at the First National Bank, he met his future wife, Doris Gwendolyn Peairs, who worked on the 9th floor of the First National Bank building for Harry Kissell at The Kissell Real Estate Company. However, World War II started and Harry volunteered to serve in the Army. He spent four years, eight months and nine days in the Pacific Theater in Company "K" of the 147th Infantry. His company was deployed to six islands in the Pacific Theater and after surviving his time in World War II, Harry returned to Springfield, the bank and his future wife.

Harry expressed to his family that it was the unanswered question of why he survived and so many did not that was the basis for his life's mission of caring for his family, his church and his community upon his return. Harry married Doris had three daughters but lost one at birth. Harry's career flourished at the Bank as he took on more responsibilities and helped many members of the community. His service to his church and the community came in the form of a never-ending willingness to answer the call to serve. This included fund raising for Clifton Avenue Methodist Church, United Way (chairing two campaigns), Lions Club (top rose seller), Shriners, Masons, Scottish Rite, the YMCA and many more worthy causes.

Peairs Family History:

The earliest members of the Peairs family arrived in Springfield in March of 1912. James Robertson Peairs was born in Ross County, Ohio in 1873. He met and married Emma Viola Young in 1906 and took up married life on a farm in Ross County. Emma was also born in Ross County, Ohio in 1877. James served in Company "A" 26th Regiment of the United States Infantry during the Spanish American War / Philippine American War era from 1900 - 1903. Items from his service are part of the collection.

While living in Ross County they had two daughters, Thelma Louise in 1907 and Lola Ivorine in 1909. In 1912, James and Emma moved to Springfield and purchased a home located at 1219 Kenton Street across from the Buffalo Road Roller Company. James went to work for W.T. Smith Wholesale and Retail Fish Market at 128 - 130 S. Center Street. It is the current location of the Annex Building to the Heritage Center. After the move to Springfield, they had a son, James Reed, in 1914 and another daughter, Doris Gwendolyn, in 1916.

In a letter from Donna Louise (Miner) Curry, Thelma's daughter, it was noted that the oldest two sisters came down with the measles during the outbreak in 1916. It was during their illness that James Robertson also became infected. [Family verbal history has held it was due to his working in ice used at the fish market that the measles went inward instead of outward causing an abscess under his ribs.] He spent nine weeks in the hospital in Springfield and upon release went to stay with his sister, Ruth, who lived in Condit in Delaware County, Ohio where he died in January of 1917 leaving behind a wife and four children.

To support her family, Emma sent the two oldest daughters to live with family, took in boarders and fed "lunch and dinner men" from the Buffalo Road Roller shops across the street at her home at 1219 Kenton Street. Lola Peairs came back to Springfield, graduated from Springfield High School, married her high school sweetheart, William Deter Gram, and went to work for Judge Harry G. Gram in the Clark County Court House where she served more than 32 years mostly as Chief Clerk of the Probate Court until her death in 1963. William worked at Bauer Brothers Co. and retired from the William Bailey Company in 1970. He was a cousin of the Gram family that owned and operated Riverdale Dairy.

James Reed graduated from Springfield High School in 1933, served in World War II as a paratrooper in the European Theater and worked at Robbins and Myers. Doris went to Emerson Grade School, Schaefer Junior High School and graduated from Springfield High School in 1934. She went to work at Foster's Meat Market on Fountain Avenue after graduation and eventually went to work for Harry Kissell at The Kissell Real Estate Company locate on the 9th floor in the First National Bank building. Doris met her future husband, Harry Ark, while making deposits at the bank on the first floor. She waited for Harry to return from World War II and they were married on May 29, 1948 at Clifton Avenue Methodist Church. Doris was an active member of the church, the Lioness Club and local school activities with her daughters.

The two daughters, Shirley and Patti, attended Rockway School, graduated from Shawnee High School and Clark Technical College. After graduation, Shirley was hired in 1971 by J.C. Penney to help open the store when the Upper Valley Mall was built. She went on to have a 34 year career as a Civil Servant at WPAFB. Patti worked at Brooks Fashions at the mall from 1973 - 1975 and then went to work at The Kissell Company (where her mother had previously worked) from 1976 - 1994 when it closed. Patti then went to work at Springfield Federal Savings Bank that became Cornerstone Bank and is now WesBanco

from 1994 - 2003. She worked at Assurant from 2003 - 2005 and ended her career at Home City Federal Savings Bank from 2005 until 2018 when Richwood Bank acquired it.

Related Historical Details:

Under the leadership of Harry S. Kissell, The Kissell Company became a key player in the development and advancement of mortgage banking in the United States. Cyrus B. Kissell started the company in 1884 and his son, Harry S. Kissell, became President in 1906. This history is discussed in the booklet, The Kissell Company 1884 - 1984 A Century of Service that is part of the collection. It was in the late 1930s that Doris Peairs was hired to work at the Kissell Real Estate Company located in the First National Bank building that Harry S. Kissell helped build. Among her responsibilities were accepting loan payments, accounting and payroll. She was later named a Vice President of the Company and was authorized to sign checks. Doris noted that she had to sign her first and middle initials when signing checks so as not to disclose that she was a female.

In January of 1976, Patti Ark was hired by The Kissell Company and over a span of 18 years performed many of the same tasks as her Mother had performed. In addition to applying loan payments, accounting and payroll, Patti advanced into many additional positions that were created as the company grew. The Kissell Company had offices all over the United States, had over 1000 employees and was ranked as the 7th largest Mortgage Banking Company in the United States during this time period.

Pittsburgh National Bank acquired The Kissell Company in 1969. It successfully ran the company until it decided to get out of the mortgage lending business in 1985. City Federal Savings Bank of Somerset, NJ acquired the company. This decision would lead to the end of the once long-time successful company. Within three years and as part of the Savings and Loan Banking Crisis in the late 1980s, The Kissell Company/CityFed Mortgage was taken over by the Resolution Trust Corporation when the bank failed. The assets and loans were sold, people lost their jobs and a big part of Clark County history ceased to exist. It was during this period that Patti Ark was retained due to her wide background to assist in the final liquidation and in essence became one of the last employees of The Kissell Company.

When the final accounting for The Kissell Company was completed in January of 1994, Patti Ark entered the banking phase of her career. Her background at The Kissell Company provided knowledge in mortgage banking, compliance and audit that was needed at Springfield Federal Savings and Loan. The name was changed in June of 1994 to Springfield Federal Savings Bank when it converted from a mutual bank to a stockholder owned bank. Subsequently the name was changed to Cornerstone Bank in 1997 before WesBanco acquired it in 2003.

Patti left banking for two years to work at Assurant before returning to utilize her banking skills at Home City Federal Savings Bank. History has shown that it is harder for small institutions to survive and be competitive. Richwood Bank acquired Home City Federal Savings Bank in 2018 at which time Patti retired after roughly 25 years in banking.

Scope and Content

The Ark/Peairs Family Collection contains documents and objects donated by Shirley and Patti Ark. Most of the information within the collection pertain to the careers and community involvement of Harry, Doris, Shirley and Patti Ark. Also included in the collection is information about William and Lola (Peairs) Gram, James Robertson and Emma (Young) Peairs and James Reed Peairs. The years encompassed in the collection is 1868 - 2018.

Series 1 contains biographical and personal information relating to Harry A. Ark. The documents contain information on his education, family, church activities, WW II military service, banking career at First National Bank and community service.

Series 2 contains biographical and personal information relating to Doris G. (Peairs) Ark. The documents contain information on her education, family, church activities, scrapbook, trips and friends (Ruth and Dietrich Neufeld - Ruth traveled with Doris and are in several photo albums and Dietrich did a painting of Clifton Avenue Methodist Church that is in the collection).

Series 3 contains biographical and personal information relating to Patti S. Ark. The documents contain birth cards and receipts, youth club activities, school activities, college and employment (Brooks Fashions, The Kissell Company, Springfield Federal, Assurant and Home City Federal).

Series 4 contains biographical and personal information relating to Shirley K. Ark. Currently the documents contain birth cards and receipts and Retirement Ceremony documents from WPAFB. Spaced is being allowed for additional school and career documents to be donated in the future.

Series 5 contains biographical and personal information relating to the three doses of the Polio Vaccination as documented on the cards for the Harry Ark family from 1962 - 1963.

Series 6 contains biographical and personal information relating to James Robertson Peairs. The documents contain military service records from the Spanish American/Philippine American War and a picture book of Manila, Cuba, Puerto Rico, Hawaii, California and Japan from the early 1900s.

Series 7 contains biographical and personal information relating to Emma V. (Young) Peairs. The documents contain wedding details, estate papers, pension letter for husband's Spanish American/Philippine American War service and letters from Home City Council No. 27 - Daughters of America.

Series 8 contains biographical and personal information relating to Lola I. (Peairs) Gram. The documents contain school papers, scrapbook, perpetual diary, Probate Court career, marriage and posthumous recognition.

Series 9 contains the biographical and personal information relating to William D. Gram. The documents contain William's obituary, a pencil drawing of Lola Gram, work ID and photos he took.

Series 10 contains the biographical and personal information relating to James Reed Peairs. The documents contain school records and activities, youth activities, work and college papers.

Series 11 contains a wide variety of individual photographs and albums. There are photographs of all of the people listed in the 10 previous series at their jobs, weddings, military service, school events, community service, church and related family members. There is one Hollinger box (#4) of photos and photo albums. There is also one oversized box (#7) with photos that did not fit in the other box.

Series 12 contains oversized or fragile material from other series in the collection. Box #5 contains Harry Ark's Masonic Membership Certificate and a 1965 United Appeals Fund Scrapbook. It also contains Patti Ark's grade school campaign poster and oversized Kissell Communique Newsletters. Box #6 contains Emerson Grade School Certificate, Springfield High School Diplomas for Doris Peairs Ark and Lola Peairs Gram, Lola's Certificate of High School Credits, Lola's Business School Certificate, Pencil drawing of Lola Gram by William Gram and a wrapped special edition newspaper from the 1978 Blizzard.
