

This was a series of Sunday photos and captions that ran in the Springfield News-Sun from 1934-1935. A typewritten abstract was created by researcher Mary Vasseur at one point, possibly in 1960s/1970s. In the 20teens, volunteers created the spreadsheet index here, indexing from printed microfilm of the photos. In 2022, information from Mary Vasseur's abstracts was added to the spreadsheet.
