SCOPE AND CONTENT

To determine the time span of this collection one has to look at the collection in different categories. Series I, II, and III, family or personal files, range in years from approximately 1919 – 1990's. Series IV and V, family genealogical research information, of course covers many years. Series VI is a picture collection including pictures from early years up to recent.

The collection includes mostly personal and professional materials for the individual family members and the research information collected while studying their personal family genealogy.

A more detailed content of each of the series and sub-series follows.

INTRODUCTION

This collection contains information about the Fisher Family. Thomas Guy Fisher and Lillian Chapman Fisher had five children, Ilo, Betty, Mary, Ed, and Carol. Most of the collection is made up of personal and professional files from Carol Fisher and Ilo Fisher, however, it also includes some information and family archival material from other siblings and extended family. Included in this collection is an entire sub-series of their personal family research and genealogy materials. The names found in these specific materials have been indexed to facilitate genealogical research.

There are 6 series in the collection, 2 of which contain sub-series. The Carol Fisher series contains 4 sub-series. The Ilo Fisher series contains 5 sub-series. The other four series do not have sub-series. The collection fills 19 boxes. There are 16 record size boxes which include 14 filled with files (2 are photo albums), 1 containing Betty Fisher's retirement scrapbooks and 1 box of books. There is 1 oversized box, and 3 document boxes which include 1 box of video and audio tapes and 2 boxes of picture files.

BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

This collection is comprised of information gathered by members of the Fisher family of Clark County Ohio. The majority of the collection comes from the 5 children of Thomas and Lillian Fisher who lived on a farm on Detrick Jordan Pike most of their lives. These children were Ilo, Carol, Betty, Ed and Mary.

Ilo Fisher:

Ilo was born October 18, 1913 in Clark County. She graduated from Wittenberg University in 1935 with a Bachelors of Arts degree and in 1951 from the University of Illinois with a second Bachelors and a Masters degree in Library Science and Media. In 1936 she joined Wittenberg University as head librarian and cataloguer. She spent 41 years at Wittenberg heading up the library, the science library and was involved in the development of plans for the new library. She retired from Wittenberg in 1979. From 1943-1946 she left Wittenberg to be the head reference librarian at Warder Public Library. Following her retirement she started the Black Horse Press in her home.

She was involved in many genealogical organizations including heading up the Friends of the Library which was associated with Warder Public Library. She was also involved in the Altrusa Club, amateur printing groups and conservative organizations.

Ilo died August 11, 1995.

Carol Fisher:

Carol was born May 19, 1934. Carol was also a graduate of Wittenberg University with a Bachelors degree and from Ball State University with her Masters. Later, she attended Ohio State University where she received her doctorate. She taught at South High School in Springfield from 1956-59 prior to being employed by Ball State University. From 1959-1963 she became a core junior high teacher at the Burris Laboratory School at Ball State. In 1963-65 she took a sabbatical to go to Ohio State University where she was an Assistant Instructor of the College of Education and received her doctorate. In 1965 she returned to Ball State University where she worked at the Burris Lab again and became an Assistant Professor of Secondary, Adult and Higher Education. She remained in this position until 1968 when she became the Director of Independent Study and Continuing Education for Women. Later, from 1977-87 she was the Director of the Minnetrista Center and in 1987 became the Director of Gateway Services for Non-Traditional Adult Studies.

Carol was also interested in genealogy and started a genealogical research and services business, Heritage Hunter, in Muncie, IN. She was involved in many professional organizations and genealogical organizations. She was a writer and was recognized especially for her poetry.

Carol died January 23, 1992.

Betty Fisher:

Betty was born August 28, 1915 in Springfield, Ohio. She was a teacher in the Springfield City Schools from 1938-1988. She also served as a consultant for the school system's testing program for the State of Ohio and as the Director of Elementary Curriculum.

Betty was involved in the Altrusa Club and other professional organizations.

Betty died October 24, 2002.

Thomas Edwin Fisher (Ed):

Ed was born September 2, 1922. He graduated from Springfield High School in 1941. After that he became a farmer, raising freezer beef and sweet corn from 1950-1968.

Ed died January 10, 2003

Mary Fisher:

Mary was born March 27, 1918. Mary was a graduate of Springfield High School and Wittenberg University. She was formerly employed by Springfield News-Sun and the Springfield City Schools. She also taught in Bishop, CA.

Mary was the only one of the 5 children who married. She married George Allen Schneider. She resided in California for many years.

Mary died April 16, 1994 in Glendale, California.

I. CAROL FISHER SERIES

This series contains information gathered throughout Carol Fisher's life. It includes both professional and personal material. Included in this series are the following sub-series topics: Ball State University, Heritage Hunter, Minnetrista and Personal. More detailed information on these follow.

1. Sub-Series : Ball State University

This sub-series contains information having to do with the time Carol spent working at Ball State University. There are items from her tenure at Burriss Laboratory School and also in the Continuing Education Program. These files also include correspondence from various professional contacts and information from other conferences and programs she participated in.

There are 58 files in this sub-series.

2. Sub-Series : Heritage Hunter

This sub-series includes information related to Carol's work in genealogy during the time she was involved with the Heritage Hunter. Heritage Hunter was a genealogical research and services business founded by Carol in Muncie, Indiana. The majority of files in this sub-series contain genealogical information on families who were researched by this organization. These surnames and researcher names are listed alphabetically in the "Family Names" chart following the series' file listings and the file numbers are noted.

There are 52 files in this sub-series.

3. Sub-Series : Minnetrista

This sub-series contains general information and correspondence regarding the Minnetrista Center. The Minnetrista Center was a center for Nontraditional Adult studies under the auspices of the School of Continuing Education at Ball State University. This center was to provide educational programs designed to meet the needs of adults not enrolled in traditional academic credit programs. The purpose of the center was to provide programs, educational planning assistance, outreach and program development for agencies and organizations. There are annual reports for the years 1978-1985.

There are 19 files in this sub-series.

4. Sub-Series : Personal

Included in this sub-series is a variety of information regarding Carol's doctoral educational pursuits, her writings and her journals. Of specific notation are 3 files of correspondence with Ross Mooney, a professional colleague and friend. There are also 3 files containing personal journals. Of special interest are Carol's original writings for which she was recognized.

II. ILO FISHER SERIES

This series contains materials collected in Ilo Fisher's life including information from her work with Wittenberg and also the Friends of the Library organization. The sub-series topics which it includes are : Frantz Family Collection, Friends of the Library, Genealogy-History, Miscellaneous, and Wittenberg. More detailed information on each sub-series follows.

1. Sub-Series: FRANTZ FAMILY COLLECTION

This sub-series contains extensive genealogical information gathered regarding the Frantz family. It has draft and final copies of the book Burial: Frantz Family & Relatives. It also contains 25 files of in-depth genealogical information apparently gathered to be used in the development of a book on the Frantz family. However, if this was done, the Heritage Center does not have a final copy of the book. Of special interest are 2 files, Dore's Trip Around the World, which was apparently written aboard a military ship, and the USS Enterprise Letters.

There was correspondence related to the selling of the book, Burial: Frantz Family & Relatives, handled by Friends of the Library placed in the sub-series, Friends of the Library.

There are a total of 37 files in this sub-series.

2. Sub-Series: FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY

This sub-series contains records, correspondence and general information of the Friends of the Library organization that operated through the Warder Public Library. It also contains genealogical queries that were submitted to the organization for research. There are 5 specific files and 4 files containing miscellaneous queries. These surnames and searchers' names are listed on the composite family list found following this scope and content.

There are a total of 23 files in this sub-series.

3. Sub-Series: Genealogy-History

This sub-series contains some files on general genealogy and historical information. It also contains files that have genealogical research information on specific families. There are 3 specific files and 1 miscellaneous file having this information. Some of these names seem to be connected with some of the family names in the Friends of the Library queries, however, there was no designation on the documents to verify that they were Friends of the Library queries. These family names are listed on the composite family list found following this scope and content.

There are a total of 11 files in this sub-series.

4. Sub-Series: Miscellaneous

This sub-series contains a variety of files with both personal and family information. It also contains files regarding individuals such as George Blackman, MD, Catherine Drinker Bowen, Lois Lenski and Margaret Baker. Margaret Baker's file is stored in a separate oversized box due to the size of it. There are 3 files of articles written by William L. Shellman. It also includes 2 files of information when Ilo Fisher worked on the Graham H.S. North Central Evaluation Team.

A file to be especially noted is the Court of Common Pleas document from Union County. On the back of this document is a short story. It is not known who wrote the story or the importance of either side of the document.

There are a total of 20 files in this sub-series.

5. Sub-Series: Wittenberg

This sub-series contains a collection of memos, correspondence and reports having to do with Ilo Fisher's position as librarian at the university. It also includes 2 rough draft copies of "The Diary of Ezra Keller: First President of Wittenberg College". There is also a copy of "Wittenberg Today" highlighting the report of Ilo Fisher's retirement and the beginning of her amateur Black Horse Press. Included in the history of the library are articles copied from the Wittenberg Torch as far back as 1886.

Files 23-34 are actually books which include Wittenberg University Directories, handbooks, etc. These are found in a separate box marked books.

There are a total of 34 files in this sub-series.

III. MISCELLANEOUS FAMILY SERIES

This collection contains a variety of information particularly correspondence from other family members such as Ed, Betty, Vashti, Lillian, Luella, Bill and Esther. Of special interest are the 3 files of correspondence between Esther and Bill who were in Balboa Heights in the Panama Canal Zone and Luella. VI. FISHER PICTURE COLLECTION

This series contains pictures, picture albums, and slides collected by the Fisher Family. Some of the pictures are identified and some are not. The pictures that have been left in the albums are mostly family and home pictures. A majority of these are identified on the back and even have some of the negatives inserted behind the photos. The photos in files 39 and 40 were taken from two loose pages of an album. The photos were kept together as a result. They are identified on the back. The slides have not been verified, but it is believed that they are pictures of a trip that Ilo and Carol Fisher took to England.

The photos have been divided by size, subject, and media – black and white or color.

There are 2 boxes of photo albums (files 1-9 and 10-16). The box containing files 10-16 houses the slides. There are also two boxes of files of pictures (files 17-32 and files 33-62).
